Imagine learning your child has cancer. Life is never again the same. Expenses increase dramatically, you are hit with unexpected costs for transportation back and forth to treatment, childcare for siblings, eating out because you are at the hospital, and other expenses like

co-pays, and medication. As the parent, you must leave your job (often without pay) to help your child fight for his or her life.

84% of families with a child with cancer will experience some level of financial hardship. 12% of families with a child with cancer will spend more than \$10,000 annually on treatment, not including these unexpected, hidden expenses.

"I called the Jay Fund to ask for help. In classic form, you responded quickly with love and support and within hours my expenses were covered."
