UPDATE ON SAVAMMAN

In November 2017, Savannah was 6 years old when she was diagnosed with Metastatic Ewing Sarcoma - a rare, aggressive bone cancer which had spread to her lungs.

Now 7 years old and a year into her cancer journey, Savannah's family is currently making the 60 mile trip to the clinic every three weeks. In addition, she is going to physical therapy weekly to regain muscle mass that was lost as a result from radiation and Savannah has to be retrained to walk properly.

Amidst all of her appointments, recently the Jay Fund was able to give Savannah and her family a "day off" from cancer as they enjoyed Sesame Street Live together. As a family of 7, an outing like this is considered a luxury. "Even with insurance, there is a fear of not knowing all the expenses and unpredictable bills. Just knowing the Jay Fund is there helps," said Savannah's mom, Sarah.
