

Eric has performed in some notable New York City venues such as Carnegie Hall, Don't Tell Mamas, Broadway Sessions, and most recently 54 Below. In competitions he has won 1st place in the Classical Singer Music Theatre division and 3rd place in NATS. This past year Eric made his Operatic debut as Rinuccio in Gianni Schicchi at MSU and professionally. Over the summer, at The Quisisana Resort, Eric continued with his Operatic pursuits playing Tamino in The Magic Flute: "IN SPACE" and Gastone in La Traviata. Eric is now looking forward to playing Cat in the Hat in Seussical in the coming 2 weekends of October!

Christian Šebek-

(Tenor/Faculty Concordia College/IVAI NYC/Savannah Voice Festival) is a successful voice teacher and performer in New York City and New Jersey. He has performed from Opera to Broadway, Off-Broadway, television, film and international concert halls. Most noticeably, he performed as Ubaldo Piangi in The Phantom of the Opera over 1600 times. He portrayed the lead role of Nathanael in Thomas Cabaniss's Off-Broadway contemporary opera, The Sandman. He performed in Andrew Miller's The Birth of Christ performed for Pope Benedict and the Vatican starring Jim Caviezel, Michael York, and Lou Gossett Jr. Jingles Artist and at Comedy Central, Last Week Tonight with John Oliver and Lesser Prophets with John Turturro, Scott Glen, and Elizabeth Perkins. He was the vocal director for Harlem Aria, starring Damon Wayans, Paul Sorvino and Christian Carmargo. His opera highlights include: Rodolfo in La bohème, Manrico in Il Trovatore, Cavaradossi in Tosca, Radames in Aida, Calaf in Turandot, Otello in Otello, Samson Luigi in Il Tabarro, Pinkerton in Madame Butterfly, Canio in I Pagliacci and many more. He was the former General Director of Stern's World Music Record Label/Latin Billboard Top Ten-Africando 1992-2008 and a former Artistic Administrator of Chautauqua Opera in 2001/2002.

Clara Luz Iranzo-

Clara Luz Iranzo has made her appearance in opera and concert work in Europe, Mexico, Puerto Rico and the United States. She has portrayed various operatic roles including Ilia in Idomeneo in Greece, Theresa Álvarez in Missy Mazzoli 's The Listeners, and most recently Lauretta in Gianni Schicchi and Buoso 's Ghost (Michael Ching), Prima Maschera in Zandonai's Romeo and Juliet. Additionally, she made her role debut as Zerlina in Don Giovanni both at Phoenicia International Festival of the Voice and the Rhodes International Festival in Greece. Ms. Iranzo has been a young artist with Camerata Bardi Vocal Academy (2020-2022), Mannes Opera (2018-2021), and a studio artist at International Vocal Arts Institute in New York (2019), Savannah Voice Festival (2016) and Campamento de Canto Lírico (2016). She was also part of the prestigious voval academy of Houston Grand Opera. She has collaborated with the Symphonic Orchestra of Puerto Rico, the Foundation of Zarzuela and Opereta of Puerto Rico, the Lyric Choral of Puerto Rico and the United Nations in numerous concerts and productions. A graduate from Mannes School of Music (The New School), Iranzo is currently pursuing graduate studies at Monrclair State university where she recently was named a winner of thr Concerto Competition and the 2nd Annual Cali School of Music Vocal Scholarship Competition, awarding her a full ride for her studies. She will be making her debut as Blanche de la Force in MSU's production in January.

Mya Emperatriz Rodriguez Joaquin is a dancer, actress, and artist from West New York, NJ - She attends New York University's Tisch School of Arts and Steinhardt School of Culture, Education, & Human Development studying Media, Culture, Communications & Drama! Mya was diagnosed with Stage 2A Bulk Hodgkin's Lymphoma at the age of 17, undergoing numerous surgeries and chemotherapies that resulted in the absence of her high school graduation and first year at NYU. Nonetheless, Mya is the founder of her own non-profit "The Brave Place" - The Brave Place is a pre-professional developmental company for young actors. Meet The Band

A Special Thank You is in order for our amazing Musical Director and Pianist Dr. Mory Ortman. We are so thankful for your work and support as we prepared for the concert!

Dr. Mory Ortman works as a Music Director and freelance musician in New York City, where his work includes accompanying and performing in the most prestigious venues with the highest-level music professionals. He frequently accompanies and coaches main stage auditioners and professional and graduate voice lessons. Dr. Ortman is a principal accompanist for Manhattan Concert Productions, a company dedicated to excellence in music for the most qualified arts organizations in the US. Dr. Ortman also sings in and accompanies the Manhattan Chorale, a professional choral ensemble affiliated with the organization. Mory has a strong knowledge of musical styles and is equally comfortable in the classical, cabaret, and musical theatre realms. His versatility keeps him in high demand as a recitalist and accompanist throughout the greater New York City area and beyond. Summer finds Dr, Ortman working at Quisisana Resort in Maine where he serves as the Music Director of the classical program and accompanist to the musical theatre programs. The resort produces a combination of opera, musical theatre, cabaret and chamber music and is renowned for the high caliber performances presented.

Josh Dewalt (Drums)- Joshua DeWald is currently the elementary band director for Nutley Public Schools, where he has spent the past 12 years teaching band, choir and general music. Previously, he taught band, choir and general music for three years in Lyndhurst School District. He earned a Masters Degree in Educational Leadership from Montclair State University, a Bachelor of Music in Music Education from William Paterson University, and a Performance Certificate from the Atlanta Institute of Music and Media. He has performed and recorded with the New Jersey Percussion Ensemble, and has been a guest soloist on the New Music Concert Series at WPU. He has been teaching drums privately since 2001 and has played drums with various artists up and down the east coast.

Ken O'Rourke (Bass)- Ken O'Rourke is a multi-instrumentalist and educator. He began studying drums at age 7, guitar at 11, and bass guitar at 13. As a percussionist in school, he participated in the New Jersey All-State Youth Orchestra as principal timpanist at age 14, and received best soloist awards in region-wide high school jazz band competitions both as a drummer and as a vibraphonist. He received his BM in Music Education and Percussion with a Jazz Minor at Ithaca College. In his career as a percussionist, he has performed in such venues as the Kennedy Center, Lincoln Center, NJPAC, Le Poisson Rouge, and the Rudolfinum in Prague, and has worked with conductors Alan Pierson, Michael Riesman, and James Baker. As a drummer he performed with The Dorothy Cotton Jubilee Singers at the Kennedy Center Millenium Stage and at Poor People's Campaign rallies in Binghamton NY and Gouldsboro NC alongside Rev. William Barber II. As an electric bassist, drummer, and percussionist, he continues to perform extensively with many bands and projects of varying styles in and around NYC, including regular residencies at venues such as The Bitter End. He received a Masters in Music from Mannes School of Music in 2021, and he currently lives in Jersey City where he continues to teach and perform.

About The Jay Fund


The Tom Coughlin Jay Fund Foundation was created in honor of Jay McGillis.

Jay was a special young man who developed leukemia while a member of Coach Coughlin's team at Boston College. In the eight months between Jay's diagnosis and the day he lost his battle with cancer, the Coughlin family saw first hand the physical, emotional, and financial strains the illness caused the McGillis Family. After going through the tragic events with Jay's family, Coach Coughlin vowed that if he ever had the chance, he would create a way to help families with children battling cancer.

Coach Coughlin kept his vow and started this foundation to be there in Jay's honor. For over 25 years, the Jay Fund has evolved in size and scope. We have helped over 5,600 families and given away over \$20 million in grants helping families in Northeast Florida and the New York/New Jersey

Metropolitan Area.

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

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
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
